COMMENTS TO THE AUTHOR:

Reviewer #1: Dear author(s),

I liked the topic as well as the way you have examined it. As the determinants of women's entrepreneurial intentions are marginally studied in the literature, and encouraging social empowerment is also less studied, I believe that this research could contribute to the extant body of the literature. Nevertheless, there are a few points to be considered to improve the quality of your manuscript.

First of all, the authors might change the title to "Determinants of Women's Entrepreneurial Intention in Encouraging Social Empowerment: An Empirical Study" or "Determinant Factors of Women's Entrepreneurial Intention in Encouraging Social Empowerment: An Empirical Study".

Secondly, make your abstract attractive to readers (simple sentences without any repetition) and include 2-3 sentences ready to be cited exactly as they are. In 1 paragraph, your abstract should tell the readers why the study is important (maximum 25% of the text), what you did, i.e. your methodology (maximum 25% of the text), and what you found, i.e. main research results and their major implications (50% of the text). This is very important to promote your work because

of the growing trend that authors use Google search to find and cite papers based on the abstract (instead of reading the full paper).

Thirdly, please add the structure of the manuscript at the end of the Introduction. It makes your manuscript more reader-friendly.

The literature review is good. Nevertheless, the following references could also be useful:

It is mentioned that the sample size was determined by Slovin's formula. Then, you would better mention the reference. Ryan, T. P. (2013). Sample size determination and power. John Wiley & Sons: New York.

Please compare your findings with those of the others to elaborate on your theoretical contribution.

In sum, I encourage the authors to keep working on their research. The topic seems highly interesting and the empirical setting promising, and I am convinced that with some extra effort, the authors could provide a publishable manuscript worth of publication in the Service Business journal.

Reviewer #2: Dear Author(s)

I had the pleasure of getting the opportunity to review this interesting study. The paper titled: "Determinants Factors of Women's Entrepreneurial Intention in Encouraging Social Empowerment: An Empirical Study", in particular, studied "women's entrepreneurial intentions". The empirical setting is interesting and offers good context to research the field. I think the used methodological framework also offers a description of the complexity of the research field. However, I think there are a few minor shortcomings that need to be amended prior to acceptance for publication. Therefore, I suggest that the author(s) considers to improve their interesting work by embedding my below suggestions:

- 1. Some of the previous literature provides the same definition between the terms orientation and intention, while in this study the two terms become 2 different variables. Please explain the difference between the two concept variables.
- 2. Please see Table 2 and Table 3, there is typo in the name of variable: women entrepreneurial orientation
- 3. Please check the writing of symbols for the determination (R2) and the prediction of relevance (Stone Geisser Q2), pay attention to the use of subscripts and superscripts.
- 4. In the list of references there are 2 differences in the title of the paper in the same year, please state the difference in the references to the contents which the reference refers to.

5. Please check the Fornel-Larcker results again and make sure that the loading scores for each indicator show the higher score of each cross loading for constructs on the same column and row.

- 6. Please delete this part from the title: An Empirical Study
- 7. In order to read your manuscript well, please proofread your manuscript to the professional, there are some grammatical errors.

Editor-inChief Comments:

The two reviewers made helpful suggestions on how the paper should be revised to make it publishable. In addition, I would like to suggest the following:

- 1. Title: As Reviewer #1 pointed out, "Determinants factors" are repetitive. The totle should be "Key determinants of ..."
- 2. Abstract: The first sentence should be more direct. "This paper analyzes"
- 3. In Section 3.2 Measurements, the authors need to discuss the questionnaire development process in greater detail. How was the double translation protocol undertaken (English-Indonesian-English), how many bilingual professionals were involved in each phase, was there any pretest of the questionnaire, etc.
- 4. In Table 4, the significance should be indicated by: *p<0.05; **p<0.01; ***p<0.001 (two-tailed).
- 5. The References section needs a thorough cleaning up work (e.g., mixed use of upper and lower cases for journal article titles and journal names, etc.).
- 6. If the authors decide to revise and resubmit the paper, please include a point-to-point "Response to the Editor and Reviewers' Comments."
